The Session was updated on the recent news within our denomination in regard to the recent change in our ordination standards. Suffice it to say that several questions will be answered in the coming months that will aid the Session's

discernment about our faithful navigation of these troubling times. As part of this process, Tyson and I are joining 1900 other concerned Presbyterians in Minneapolis in the days following the writing of this article for a conference called The Fellowship. Also, please be in prayer for our joint motion before our Presbytery in October regarding the explicit discussion of fidelity and chastity, as well as other ethical standards in the examination process of candidates for ministry and pastors for membership.

The work of missions continues at WPC. **Bev Sumrow**, Missions and Evangelism Chairperson, is doing a fabulous job leading our efforts to continue and even expand our ongoing work in missions. To that end, Bev and I have invited several new members to join that team. They include (mind you I'm writing from a hotel room without any notes) **Debbie Ramsey, Aveline Hewetson, Mary Zickefoose, and Nancy Foster.** Some of the effects of their work so far will include some new exterior signage for our main access doors, a shift of our visitor parking area to the North parking strip, and an expanded menu of opportunities for this year's Advent Conspiracy. On the world mission front, we will be supporting the Rodgers again this year in their work with Teethsavers. The goal for this is \$11,400. We will also be offering a handful of local projects for you to support financially - more to come as Advent draws near. Finally, the mission and evangelism staffing task force made a recommendation, which was approved, that an APNC be formed to begin the

search for an ordained pastor to fill our staff vacancy in this area.

These are just a few of the most interesting decisions your officers made this past month. Decisions are important and administration is indeed a ministry. However, we also spent a good chunk of our time discussing and identifying our top prayer priorities for WPC this coming year. This exercise was led by **Tyson Taylor** and will form a critical part of our upcoming IGNITE events. You won't want to miss these, and we're encouraging your full support in prayer and attendance.

May your heart be encouraged by this bird's eye view of all your officers are accomplishing for the glory of God and the building of His kingdom in and through this place.

# Music Ministry

## Praise to the Lord, the Almighty (#8)

**Text:** Joachim Neander

**Music:** LOBE DEN HERREN

This hymn was written by Joachim Neander, born in 1650. His father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and great-great-grandfather – all Joachim Neanders – had all been preachers of the gospel. But as a student, the youngest Joachim was both wild and rebellious. At the age of 20, he joined a group of students who descended on St. Martin's Church in Bremen to ridicule and scoff the worshippers – the earliest known version of a "Flash Mob." But the sermon which was delivered that day by Reverend Theodore Under-Eyck spoke to Neander's very soul and led to his conversion. And as God would have it, just a few years later the youngest Joachim was the assistant minister at that very church!

Joachim often took long walks near his hometown of Hochdal, Germany. These leisurely walks would have been considered "worship walks" on which he frequently composed hymns as he strolled, singing them to the Lord. He was the first hymn writer from the Calvinist branch of Protestantism. When he was but 30 (the year of his death) he wrote these words while battling tuberculosis:

*Praise to the Lord, the Almighty,  
the King of Creation.  
my soul praise Him,  
for He is Thy Health and Salvation.*

The story continues! One of Joachim's favorite walking spots was a beautiful gorge a few miles from Dusseldorf. The Dussel River flowed through the valley, and Joachim so loved this spot that it eventually was

named for him – Neander Valley! The Old German word for "valley" was "tal" or "thal" (with a silent "h"). Two hundred years later Herr von Beckersdorf owned Neander's Valley, a source of fine limestone, used to manufacture cement. In 1856, miners discovered caves which contained human bones. Beckersdorf took the bones to a local science teacher who speculated they belonged to one who had died in "The Flood." Hang with me just a little longer ...

When William King, an Irish professor of anatomy, saw the bones, he claimed they were proof of evolution's famous "missing link." Other fossils were taken from the caves in the valley, and for many years these specimens were used to "prove" Darwin's theory of evolution. Today we know these "bones of contention" as the bones from Neander's Valley ... we say they are the bones of Neanderthal Man ... fully human, an extinct people of great strength!

One expert said, "when Joachim Neander walked in his beautiful valley so many years ago, he could not know that hundreds of years later his name would become world famous, not for his hymns celebrating creation, but for a concept that he would have totally rejected: human evolution."

## Death of Former Pastor

Rev. William S. Smith, who served as Pastor of Westminster from January of 1962 through July of 1969, died on March 29, 2011, in Charlottesville, VA. Bill was born October 12, 1926, in Austin, Texas. He graduated from the University of Texas in 1948 and from Union Theological Seminary in New York in 1951. Noted theologian Reinhold Niebuhr described Bill's Bachelor of Divinity thesis as "the best...I have read so far" and "a most discriminating piece of work."

After seminary, Bill returned to Texas and served churches in Hamilton and Brownwood prior to being called to Westminster. The Sanctuary unit at Westminster was built and dedicated during his ministry here. He served the larger church as Moderator of Presbytery of the Southwest (before organization of Palo Dura Presbytery) and after moving to Charlottesville, served in the Virginias. After 22 years as Pastor of Westminster Presbyterian Church in Charlottesville, he retired at the end of 1991. After retiring, he served eight years as a chaplain at the Health Care Center of Westminster-Canterbury. Sadly, he suffered a severe stroke some years prior to his death.

Bill is survived by his wife of 64 years, Clare; and their daughters Dorothy Smith and Kathy Smith Dunder. Their daughter, Anne Smith Shumake, died in October of 1998.
