Faith's Review and Expectation

January Session Highlights - by Baron Eliason

The title of this article is taken from the words of John Newton. "Faith's Review and Expectation" was the original title of the beloved hymn, *Amazing Grace*. As Robert Morgan writes in *Then Sings My Soul*, "It is based on Newton's study of 1 Chronicles 17: 16-17: 'King David...said: Who am I, O Lord God? And what is my house, that You have brought me this far? And yet...You have also spoken of Your servant's house for a great while to come, and have regarded me according to the rank of a man of high degree....'" As we concluded our first Session meeting of 2011, I couldn't help but recognize how that meeting had been "faith's review and expectation" for us as a congregation. It is a story of amazing grace and will require amazing grace to complete.

In that short meeting we saw the many ways Westminster will be in mission. There will be three trips this year outside our borders (China, Belize, Nicaragua) to work with missionaries sent and supported from this church. Locally, we are filling our buildings on 34th Street with mission groups. The first is the Texas Ramp Project. On the horizon is a project of WoW called "Loads of Love," and more is coming.

Administratively, Westminster is working hard to ensure all of the behind the scenes aspects of running a church are in order. These efforts

include the following: the formation of a Foundation Board for the development of our endowments and other giving, entering into a maintenance contract which promises to insure that all of our building systems are properly maintained, establishing the life expectancy of all our systems through the help of the engineering and architecture firm of Parkhill, Smith and Cooper, and the prayerful consideration of future projects by our Master Planning Committee. Additionally, we have been faithful in our giving such that we've ended 2010 in the black and have met our pledging goals for 2011.

In the area of staffing, the Session has invested in a vision for our youth, young adults, and men's ministries. The latest step in this direction was the approval of a co-director model for youth ministry featuring both a male and a female on that team. Meanwhile, the searches for these positions and for our new Associate Pastor are going very well. In God's amazing grace we will fill these positions, and for the first time since I arrived here, we will be fully staffed in accordance with our strategy and vision.

Finally, the ministries of connecting thirsty people to receive and share the living water of Christ are growing in momentum at every level.

Additionally, we have had a wonderful group of people join the church this past year who will participate in these ministries. One of the most exciting ministries currently under redevelopment is that of prayer. I'll have more to say about that in the next Chimes. Suffice it to say, having blessed us in so many ways already, and with so many great endeavors yet to come, God is calling us to turn to Him in prayer that His amazing grace will continue to flow.

As I write this article, I'm overwhelmed at the blessing, the amazing grace that God is showering upon this congregation. Faith's review and expectation for WPC is a wondrous tale. I hope this short review is as sweet a sound to your ears as it is to mine. I'm humbled by the truth that in this short article I've only touched on a few of the highlights. God has blessed us richly.

In His amazing grace, that will continue. In His grace this will be a season in our lives together where the pews are full, His word is preached, our knees are bent in prayer, our hands are calloused from serving, our hearts are connected in love, and our feet have taken the good news to a thirsty world. What a gift God gives that we might witness to this and join His amazing grace together.

I'll Fly Away (#554)

Text and Music by Albert E. Brumley

This hymn is often listed as a favorite, so it seems logical to explore the roots of this famous hymn. "I'll Fly Away," written by Albert E. Brumley in 1929, is a hymn most associated with American Baptists and the Churches of Christ. It is an optimistic song about an earthly death that leads to everlasting life in glory with Christ. "I'll Fly Away" has been called the most recorded gospel music song, beginning with a recording by James and Martha Carson, the "Barn Dance Sweethearts" of WSB Atlanta, in 1946, followed two years later by the Chuck Wagon Gang in 1948. The hymn has been covered by numerous singers but usually associated with country or gospel music, particularly the variety referred to as "shape note music".

"I'll Fly Away" was recorded and performed by Jars Of Clay. The first recording of the song by Jars Of Clay appears on the various artists compilation album, *WOW Worship: Red*, which was released in 2004. The song was re-recorded in 2005 for inclusion on the band's studio album, *Redemption Songs*, and released as the second radio single in promotion of the album.

If you think that you have heard this before the Jars of Clay album, you would most likely be right! This is an impressive list of artists: Selah Jubilee Singers (1941 - Decca), The Dillards (*Wheatstraw Suite*, 1966), Ian Matthews/Plainsong (*In Search of Amelia Earhart*, 1972), Vern Gosdin (2, *does not exist*) 1985), Alison Krauss and Gillian Welch (*O Brother, Where Art Thou?*, 2000), Alan Jackson (*Precious Memories*, 2006), Brenda Lee (2, *does not exist*) 2002), Tammy Wynette, Crystal Gayle (*Someday (Crystal Gayle album)*, 1995), Ralph Stanley (*Shine On*, 2005), Kanye West (*The College Dropout*, 2004), Johnny Cash (*My Mother's Hymn Book*, 2004), Hot 8 Brass Band (2, *does not exist*) 2005), Andy Griffith (*Somebody Bigger Than You and I*), The Dirty Dozen Brass Band (2, *does not exist*) 2004), The Word (*The Word Album*, 2001), Avalon (*Faith: A Hymns Collection*, 2006), Kossoy Sisters with Erik Darling (2, *does not exist*) 1956), The Blind

Boys of Alabama (*Down in New Orleans*, 2008), Randy Travis (*Worship & Faith*, 2003), Castanets (2), (*does not exist*) 2008), Hank Williams, The Avett Brothers, Mark Klein (It's Just Me, 2004), All Angels Fly Away, 2009, Daniel O'Donnell (*Peace in the Valley*, 2009), The Elms Concert at the Vogue Theater in Indianapolis, November 13, 2009, Flatfoot 56, Mississippi John Hurt, Treme Brass Band.

The television series *I'll Fly Away* was named after the hymn. The hymn appears on the soundtrack of Spike Lee's film *When the Levees Broke*. An episode of the television series *The Waltons* included Jason singing this hymn numerous times. This hymn was played during the final scene of the final episode of the series *7th Heaven* (played and sung by Alison Krauss and Gillian Welch). It was also played on the movie *O Brother, Where Art Thou?* and is played on the movie's soundtrack in *The Apostle*. The hymn is performed by a choir in a New Mexico church in the movie *I'll Fly Away* at the Internet off-Broadway Database (1979) which stars former child evangelist Marjoe Gortner. Curiously, it is sung by mourners at a funeral in the film *The Curious Case of Benjamin Button*. The first season finale of the HBO program *Treme* is named after the hymn, and it is performed at the end of the episode.

If you are like me, you hear this hymn and you just start singing along ... it's **really** that good!

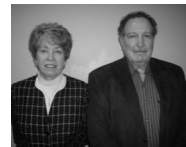

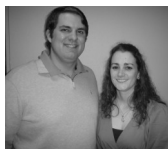
