Comings and Goings

“Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another and all the more as you see the Day approaching” Hebrews 10:25.

This verse from Hebrews comes under the heading “a call to persevere.” Perseverance is generally defined as steady persistence in a course of action especially in spite of difficulties, obstacles, or discouragement. A second “theological” meaning of the word is “continuance in a state of grace to the end, leading to eternal salvation.” The perseverance Paul is focused on is twofold: drawing near to God and encouraging one another toward love and good deeds. Interestingly, both of these are tied by Paul to the issue of showing up to worship.

Worship is at the core of our humanity. God designed us for worship as evidenced by the fact that we are prone to doing so. By that I mean, we can worship nearly anything. Perhaps the best evidence of this is our own buildings. Our greatest cathedrals are not churches but shopping malls, ball parks, amusement parks, casinos, and the like. All of these cathedrals are monuments to gods that compete for our hearts. The worship of them shapes us and those around us as well.

The shaping nature of worship is the reason God is so jealous that we would worship Him daily and weekly as a community. This truth is one of the core elements of our “Get in the FLOW” discipleship map – Worship God daily and weekly. This is because our proclivity to worship just about anything can actually lead us away from Him. The effect is amplified when our worship of other things draws us out of fellowship with other believers who might otherwise support us. The effect is multiplied in that the encouragement we would otherwise bring to others by our presence is lost as well.

This is why Paul is so adamant that we not “give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing.” Summertime attendance is habitually low. Looking at our attendance records the last three years, and then over them going back to the days of Paul Cunningham, it is clear that as a congregation we have that same habit that concerns Paul. In truth, that is the case in most churches. But “most churches” is not our standard. Our standard is faithfulness to Christ.

Therefore, I’m calling on each of us to persevere in our worship this summer. Our series in Acts has been outstanding, our music is still inspiring, the Spirit is still joining us each Sunday. The only thing lacking is faithful attendance and the ways that it mysteriously helps us to draw near to God and encourage one another in our faith. Let’s make this July and August our biggest yet.

IN OTHER NEWS

Our denomination has passed a new form of government which goes into effect on July 10th. I don’t anticipate that this will have much of an effect on Westminster PC as we have prepared for the change by adopting the former Book of Order into our Standards Of Procedure to cover any gaps that may be discovered as we go along.

Our Presbytery met this past month. As we all know by now, **Tyson Taylor** successfully passed his oral examination and was thereby cleared for his ordination and installation service here at WPC on July 31st. In other business, the Presbytery voted against inclusion of the Belhar Confession in our constitution. I was asked to speak in support of our motion to make the Code of Ethics (as amended to include a Fidelity and Chastity clause) an explicit part of the examination process of our Presbytery committees that deal with pastors and candidates. That motion will be fully considered and voted on at the October meeting.

Our Session is prayerfully seeking God’s wisdom

regarding the issues we face as members of a denomination that includes a wide variety of responses to the issue of biblical authority on the matter of sexual ethics. Tyson and I, and anyone else is invited as well, will be attending a meeting in late August called “The Fellowship,” in order to hear how other theologically like minded congregations intend to move forward.

The stated meeting of Session for June included many exciting decisions. Chief among these is the expansion of **Joe Sarrat’s** hours as custodian to 32 hours per week, approval of a plan to supplement **J.R. Cochran’s** seminary expenses (he will be distance learning) in return for a two year post-graduate commitment to WPC, approval of a contribution to Windwood PC in support of legal fees they have incurred in working to establish the property rights of Presbyterian congregations in Texas, formation of a strategic task force to make recommendations about finding a replacement for **Matt Mitchell**, and the hiring of summer intern **Jordan Simms** to work in our summer youth ministry program. New members **Daniel Kizziah** and **Rob & Carolyn Farrer** were acknowledged. Additionally, a congregational meeting is called for October 2nd for the purpose of electing officers for our Session.

Regarding the departure of **Rev. Matt Mitchell**, I again encourage each of you to face your feelings of joy and grief and to share them with the Mitchells. Also, I want to remind you that financial gifts are being collected through the church office for presentation to the Mitchells at their farewell banquet on July 17th.

Missional Thoughts

How can one accurately put into words the incredible, challenging, beautiful, difficult and Spirit-filled Mission Trip that we took to China June 5-17? I am still looking for words to express what the Lord has been doing in China and what He did for our team while we were there. This is not your usual "construction" trip where we go and build an orphanage or anything like that. Here we met with (mostly) university students who are not Christians or, at the most, "first generation" Christians. These students are struggling with being very well educated and taught to hold all religion at arm's length. However, they are seeking. Most of the students we met were curious as to why we would come 1000's of miles to talk about Christ or the Bible. Many evenings we would simply go to one of the ten universities in Guangzhou and meet with students at English Corners. These are opportunities for Chinese students to practice their English with others. You can imagine that when a group of 5-6 Americans walk up we were overwhelmed. They were so kind and generous, and they wanted to know everything about us and where we were from. Many times in the midst of conversations we were able to talk about our faith and why we are followers of Christ. It led to many discussions and even to some invitations to Bible studies that happen in different homes.

For me, the most poignant moment came when we were leading a home Bible study and went to a young Korean missionary's apartment. We followed them back to the back of the complex, entered the apartment, triple dead-bolted the door, turned off the A/C (very unfortunate...), went into a back room and locked that door as well. We then huddled around God's word and studied it. Many of the students were there for the first time and had never read the Bible. It was such an honor to sit and teach God's Word in such a manner to people who had never even heard it. As we were finishing, we had the students read together the parable of the Good Samaritan in Chinese. What a blessing. Even though I couldn't understand what they were saying I was moved by God's Spirit that was filling that room and overflowing our hearts. As I sat with tears streaming down my face I knew that I was in the presence of a mighty God.

Please continue to pray for the new believers in China and for those who will believe soon because of the amazing work of our missionaries Will and Amanda Johnson. They are home now in the States pursuing an MBA at Duke University. They will hopefully return to China in 3 years and be able to work at many different levels within the country. I would also encourage you to continue to be a sending church – a church that believes in sending people out into the world so that God's Word might be preached in powerful ways.

To say that this experience was life-changing is an understatement. This somewhat weary traveler has nothing but highest praise for our 14-member team, Will, Amanda, Beckett Johnson, and their entire China team. God is working in China. It is not easy for Christians there as they face persecution and stand firm in their faith. Later I will address China in an article specifically dedicated to just some of our experiences.

The Music Ministry at WPC is in "summer mode" but is still present in worship each Sunday. I would like to thank the musicians of our church for all of the work they do each and every year. Sunday-after-Sunday quality music rings through the halls of WPC with not only contemporary and traditional services but also combined services in which we take the best of both "styles" and come together to praise our Lord and Savior.
