May's meeting of Session covered what I call a "summer agenda." That means short. Our finances are in good shape, our ministries are planned. As such, we spent some extra time in prayer. Also, as we have at the March and April meetings, we spent considerable time on denominational concerns. Know that our Session is unanimous in their conviction that: recent changes to our Book of Order cannot be justified on biblical grounds. Pursuing the will of Christ in obedience to His word is their primary responsibility. Westminster Presbyterian will remain faithful to biblical standards regarding its stance toward practices the Bible calls sin as well as the need for repentance.

The new standard of our denomination places the onus for determining ordination standards

on the local governing body. Our Session has responded by passing the Code of Ethics I referenced last month. This code covers a number of ethical practices for our officers (as well as an ethic for staff and one for members) including the biblical standard of fidelity in marriage between a man and a woman and chastity in singleness.

This same standard has been recommended by our Session to Palo Duro Presbytery and will be voted on by them at the October meeting. In that regard, I would ask for your daily prayer for our elders as they seek God's will in leading us as a local congregation particularly with regard to our Christ-centered place in God's Church. In the near future, our Session will be

communicating with our membership by letter. In that regard, I would ask for your daily prayer for our elders as they seek God's will in leading us as a local congregation.

In other news, there is a new tree in our park on the Northeast corner. It was given in memory of **Jennifer Jones** and to the glory of God. A brief ceremony was held with the Jones's to dedicate the tree as a living reminder of Jennifer's life with us and her new life with Christ. This tree will serve as a wonderful reminder of her life and its impact on so many. Thanks be to God.

Education is something we almost all take for granted here in America. It is seen as a right – something that is given to us whether we want it or not. Our expectation is that we will have a nice school, plenty of food, books, materials, and all of the extras, too – field trips, athletics, band, choir, etc. Of course, we get most of that through our property taxes and what we "pay in," but imagine if none of that were there. Imagine if your child had a school to go to and a teacher but that was it. A uniform was required but not paid for. Food was not provided, nor books, materials or anything else. Imagine if all of the children in your school shared 5 computers that were 5-10 years old. Welcome to Belize and its educational system. **But you can change that!**

A few years ago we partnered with the King's Children's Home to ensure that all children there received a quality education - one that lasted through their senior year of high school. You can imagine this is a huge task to undertake. We tried to partner each person with a particular student but with kids coming and going in and out of the orphanage, it was difficult to keep up with who was sponsoring whom. Leslie Roach and Nancy Foster have retooled the **Belize Buddy Program** in a way that effectively serves all of the children and assures that your money is always working for a child's education.

We are looking for 75 people willing to partner with Leonie, the angel who runs the orphanage, so that her children will be ensured of the very best education they can possibly receive. This money will purchase uniforms, good lunches, and all of the materials, books and supplies they need based upon their grade. We can make a huge impact on an entire generation simply by investing in their education from a young age. Please join me as we commit to this great program. Hymns weren't printed in a bulletin...the congregation would shout them out by number. "186!"..."91!" I loved it! There were no rules, no order, none of the attention to the usual liturgy (not to diminish this currently...you have to remember, I was about 8 years old back then). It was all-out praise, and since it consisted of the congregation's favorite songs, it was powerful...powerful enough to shake the dust off your soul.

I am excited to tell you of something of a similar venture here at Westminster that will be occurring soon. On **Sunday, May 29th (Memorial Day Weekend)**, the 9am and 11am services will come together as one body for a combined service at 11am. Not only will those attending bear witness to **Tyson Taylor's** associate pastor candidacy sermon, but they will also have the joy of singing alongside fellow church family members in WPC's first "**Folk Hymn Sunday**". 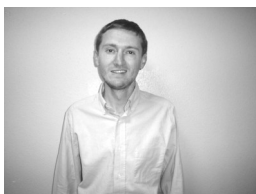
