The examination was sustained and they will be ordained and installed in January of 2011. Their work began immediately as they joined the active officers in the annual process of following up

with our membership on the stewardship campaign. As part of that process, it was reported that both 2010 revenue and 2011 pledges are looking very good so far.

With those important activities out of the way, the normal agenda items were taken up beginning with the recognition of our newest members: **Tim Allen**, and **Kenneth & Christie Benson**. The passing of Ray Adrean was also noted with sadness. In our team reports, the most notable approved recommendation involved the first of many missional projects which our 34<sup>th</sup> street properties will serve. In this case, assent was given to use a part of our warehouse for the Texas Ramp Project should the way be clear. This ministry will involve building modular sections of handicap ramps in the warehouse. These sections will then be assembled at the homes of those in Lubbock who need a ramp to safely access their homes.

As we dismissed the meeting with blessings for a Happy Thanksgiving, you could not help but feel a sense of thanks for the hard work these officers have offered to WPC this year. Thanksgiving is also due and owing to our Lord for taking the work of our hands and multiplying it into blessing upon blessing. Just this past week, these blessings included filling three thousand stockings, helping at the South Plains Food Bank, and concluding our first Wednesday Night Live format with a sustained attendance of eighty-five adults (more adults than even our Wednesday night kick-off events in recent years). And those are just a few of the things God is blessing right now.

Thanks be to God for these and all the many blessings He brings to us as a congregation. May God continue to guard and protect our fellowship and shower us with blessings as we seek to connect thirsty people to receive and to share His living waters.

# Music Ministry

## Lessons and Carols at Westminster Presbyterian

**The Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols** is a service of worship celebrating the birth of Jesus. In the formal setting of the Lessons and Carols is the story of the fall of humanity, the promise of the Messiah, and the birth of Jesus told in nine readings intermingled with the singing of Christmas carols and anthems. This service was conceived by Edward White Benson, later Archbishop of Canterbury, for Christmas Eve, **1880**. Since that time the service has been used and adapted by many churches around the world ... including our very own. The best-known version of the Lessons and Carols is an annual Christmas Eve broadcast from King's College. This particular Christmas Eve service has been held continuously since 1918 and has been broadcast every year to this day from 1928, except 1930, (even through all of World War II). You can hear this on our classical music station KOHM at 9:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve.

Today's **Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols** does not differ substantially from the first service. The opening carol is "Once in Royal David's City," usually sung unaccompanied by a solo voice. From that point, the music changes each year but the lessons do not. Each year the story of why we need a Savior, the promise of a Messiah, and His birth is again told in scripture and song. Most churches using this format have made changes over the years but the story is still told in lessons and carols. Our service will not be a strict telling of the story.

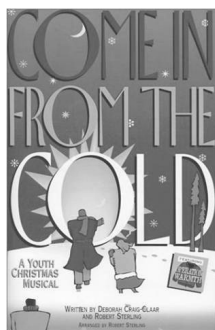
What follows are the lessons found in the traditional setting. You might want to use these in your personal devotional time during the season of Advent.

<b>Lesson One:</b>	Genesis 3:8-15, 17-19
<b>Lesson Two:</b>	Genesis 22: 15-18
<b>Lesson Three:</b>	Isaiah 9: 2; 6-7
<b>Lesson Four:</b>	Isaiah 11: 1-3a; 4a; 6-9
<b>Lesson Five:</b>	Luke 1: 26-35, 38
<b>Lesson Six:</b>	Luke 2: 1; 3-7
<b>Lesson Seven:</b>	Luke 2: 8-16
<b>Lesson Eight:</b>	Matthew 2: 1-12
<b>Lesson Nine:</b>	John 1: 1-14

This year's music will highlight music from Handel's beautiful **Messiah** which we have not done in some time. Included in the selections are not only choruses but also solos by tenor Jonathan Frugé and soprano Gina Arambura. We will also include two anthems by one of our favorite composers, John Rutter and a new offering by Pepper Choplin with bass Matt Carey, soloist. Our Praise Team will offer two special selections to enhance the service and the Children's Choirs will add that special touch that only the children can add with a rendition of "Do You Hear What I Hear?" The carols to be sung that morning (by the congregation) are "O Come, O Come Emmanuel," "It Came Upon a Midnight Clear," "What Child Is This?" "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing," "O Come, All Ye Faithful," and "Joy to the World." As you might expect, the entire service will be accompanied by our organist, Don Smith, and a full symphonic orchestra. When was the last time you had the opportunity to sing with a full orchestra? Well, you don't want to miss that!

Please remember that our **Lessons and Carols** is on the Third Sunday of Advent, **December 12<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 a.m.** The ministerial staff and all of us in the music ministry hope that you will make your plans be at Westminster that morning to celebrate as one congregation the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus.

For over 70 years, Presbyterians have given generously at Christmas to support the unmet needs of families who have devoted their lives to the mission of the PC(USA). Today this offering is shared equally by the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions, which provides critical assistance to Presbyterian church workers and their families, and Presbyterian-affiliated racial ethnic schools and colleges, which enable students to develop their gifts and find their calling. The offering dates back to the 1930s, when the former Presbyterian Church in the United States began to supplement inadequate retirement income and provide supplemental medical insurance for former ministers, missionaries, church workers, and their families.
