



## Getting in the FLOW

This is a big election year! There is a lot at stake. You might think I'm talking national politics here, but I'm talking something even more impactful on each of us – the election of our church officers at the congregational meeting scheduled for October 24th, at 10:00 AM.

It is the right of the members to elect those who will be officers in the particular church. The nomination and election process involves a sense of the call of God to serve and to use our gifts of ministry. Members voluntarily submit to the leadership of their elected officers, and the elected officers pattern their leadership in the servant model of Jesus Christ.

Our Session is comprised of three classes of elders. Each class of six serves for a period of three years. The qualities to consider in electing our elders are found at 1 Timothy 3: 1-7. They include: having a character which is above reproach, monogamous in marriage (inferring chaste in singleness), temperate, sensible, dignified, hospitable, and seasoned in faith.

Included in this article are the biographies of six nominees for elder. Each of these has been nominated from our congregation, contacted by our nomination committee, and has agreed to serve. At the October meeting of the congregation, their nominations will be placed before you for approval. In keeping with Robert's Rules of Order, other nominations may be received from the floor at this time provided the person has been contacted and is willing to serve. In this event, voting will take place by secret ballot.

As part of the Session of Westminster, these six will contribute a great deal of their time and effort to our efforts as a congregation to get in the FLOW! Please join me in praying for them and their role among us. The nominees follow.

**Cayce Noble** was born and raised in Lubbock, TX, where her family has been involved at Westminster for multiple generations. Cayce accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior in 7th grade on the WPC youth trip, The Great Escape. Since then she has been actively involved in many ministries at Westminster including serving as a Youth Ministry intern for many years, Church Officer Nominating Committee, as a Children's Ministry Sunday School teacher and volunteer, Women of Westminster Connections Team Co-Chair, and now helps lead both Weigh and Pray and the Young Adult Sunday School classes. She and her husband are also involved in a small group.

Cayce is a 30 year old mom of two children. Maryn Grace is a 5 year old Kindergartener at Roscoe Wilson and son Barret is 15 months old.
