## Session Summary

The September meeting of Session began with a very long and heart breaking list of prayer requests for members in our congregation facing death or other significant loss. There are always many concerns in a church our size but on that night, the deep concerns just kept coming. Additionally, the ten prayer priorities from IGNITE were passed out to the elders for continued prayer focus. And so we prayed. That was the most powerful action we took that night.

Following our time of prayer we gratefully acknowledged our newest members, **Marc & Kati Adams**. We also recognized the baptisms of **Christopher** and **Julian Hall** and **Evan Cash**. The deaths of **Neva Lou Kampmeier**, **Martha Daniel**, and **Zelta Hess** were also recorded.

**Roy Granbery** reported that our financial statements were in line with expectations and gave a brief update on recent progress in the development of The Foundation. The volunteer appreciation event called Comedy for Comedians with **Kenn Kington** was approved for October 19<sup>th</sup> (Details for this great event are spelled out in this edition of the Chimes). The Advent Conspiracy charities were approved for this year's sermon series. They include Hope for Nica, Family Promise, Family Guidance and Outreach, and the Westminster Helping Out fund.

Many administrative decisions were approved as well including the purchase of a new sound board for our sanctuary, needed repairs to our HVAC system, and the beginnings of needed work on the landscaping along 33rd. A called meeting of Session was set for November in order to give dedicated time for the elders to review and discuss matters related to our denomination and the Fellowship of

Presbyterians. This meeting is planned in November so that the elders will have the benefit of answers to several related issues that will hopefully be addressed or resolved during the month of October. **Rich Schempp** of Palo Duro Presbytery will be invited to make a presentation as a part of this meeting. Also approved was a committee action report from the WPC 34<sup>th</sup> Street Property Committee recommending a building use policy and a place in the structure of our church for the implantation of that policy. Finally, the names of our Mission and Evangelism APNC nominees were announced. They are **Greg Bulls**, **Bev Sumrow**, **Josh Mathis**, **Joan Sears**, and **Gene Day**.

While the most powerful action we took was prayer, the most sensational was to set a time for review and discernment of our place in the Church. While this would once have been a given rather than a topic for consideration, something has changed and it warrants our consideration. Some of that was the subject of a recent article in the AJ. While it was well written and researched, it gave the impression to many that imminent withdrawal from the PC (USA) was at hand for WPC. The truth is that discussions with the session so far have been informational in nature as events have unfolded. Further, there is a sense that the ordination issue is what "this is all about." I know that this is true for many, but upon reflection it becomes clear that the ordination issue, while very important, is the presenting issue. How we got here and how we go forward is the matter to be addressed. Needless to say, one liners and even newspaper articles simply cannot capture the complexity of this place and time. Likewise, assumptions about motivations and perspectives are not helpful. Please pray for God's guidance for our elders, peace for our

congregation, and love for one another to be the defining marks of this journey of discernment.

This letter is from one of our partner agencies:

"Today one of our after-schoolers who is 8 years old came in from school with his dad's hand print on his face. I almost cried when I saw it, it was horrible the whole side of his was bruised. I asked him what happened to his face, he replied I am so bad my dad slapped my face. I went and got a blanket and a pillow case and he cradled it while I talked to him. I called cps and the police and talked with him while we waited for them to arrive. They came took pictures and talked with him. While cps was deciding what to do I told him the blanket was his, he started crying and said no one has ever given me my own blanket can I take it home and sleep with it. /I said yes it is yours. He broke into the biggest grin he was so excited to get his own blanket, he then asked me how I got it. I told him there was this lady who loved helping kids that needed blanket and pillowcase, and that she had made this one for him. He smiled and said tell her I love her and thank you for my own blanket. It was so touching, I cried all the way home. He took his blanket with him to the hospital for x-rays. I just talked with the caseworker and she said he held his blanket the whole time. The caseworker asked him how he got the blanket and he told her this lady loves me and made it for me. Please feel free to share this with the sewing ministry, you have no idea how many smiles you bring to children who have nothing of their own. These children who are not used to having their own stuff are so excited to get the blankets and pillowcases you make .Thank you for helping make life a little better for these babies."
